We are inching our way towards Pancake Day. Do I hear shouts of "hooray!" Don't forget it's followed by a period of fasting and self-denial in Lent. We need to be aware of all the balances.

I recall the time when I was perhaps 12 or 13, and was learning German in school. I loved it, despite the very crusty old man who taught us. To balance the rather dry, repetitive learning of the complex rules of German grammar we would have an occasional lesson when we would sing German songs - entirely from the halcyon days before they were almost destroyed by the hateful, totalitarian period of Nazism and war.

We also read from children's fiction, and I dimly remember the stories about the runaway pancake - Pfannkuche - and the antics it got up to. Of course the stories were rather young for us, but since we were beginners in the language it was about all we could manage.

I loved music and singing, even at that age, and enjoyed the lessons when he would put on scratchy old recordings of music hall songs of the innocent time before the hateful Nazi regime almost put an end to them. "Wien, Wien! Nur du allein Dort, wo ich glücklich und selig bin Ist Wien, ist Wien, mein Wien!"


Just before I retired from work I was once drafted in to help cooking and consuming crepes with a class of pupils and their French pen-friends. Now why did that never happen in my grammar school German class back in 1948, at a time when the world was still recovering from a catastrophic war in Germany? Better to share Pfannkuchen than bombs.
