In today's lectionary, Timothy is told he should "discharge the duties of his ministry." Is it hard to fulfil the duties of our ministry? The Roman philosopher Seneca (Letters 120.10) says "I am no longer good through deliberate intent, but by long habit have reached a point where I am not only able to do right, but am unable to do anything but what is right." (Seneca, Letters 120.10) Steady application to fulfilling his duty has rendered him incapable of not doing right.

Wordsworth, in his Ode to Duty is grateful for the demands his duty makes upon him:

"Stern Daughter of the Voice of God!

O Duty! if that name thou love

Who art a light to guide, a rod

To check the erring, and reprove;
