#### Order for a Time of Reflection

The Travelling Nativity is a set made up of colouful wooden 'Peg dolls', that pack into the Stable for easy transport. People were invited to 'Mix and Match from the following ideas to suit their group.

- Set out the nativity figures where people can see them.
- Light the candle as a sign of light and hope.
- Bible reading Luke 2 v 1-7 or Isaiah 9 v 6-7.
- Read a section from the 'Christmas Blessings' book
- Offer the following or another prayer:

Lord our God, let your blessing come upon us. May the lights of Christmas and the figures of this Nativity be a sign of your promise to be with us throughout our life. Bring your blessings on us all as we undertake our journey through Advent. May this time of preparation be a time of unity and renewal. As these figures go out into our circuit and communities, we pray that they will serve as a witness of your presence in our world today. AMEN.
